Happy Friday, Fairhouse Families!

We have finished our second week of the last summer term. It has been another busy one here at Fairhouse. With the sun coming out, please ensure your child has a water bottle and sun hats etc.

Our year 1s, and some year2s, have sat their phonics screening check. It is always hard testing children that are so young, but they have worked really hard to learn their sounds and have done a fantastic job.

On Wednesday, Year 2 travelled across the Dartford Crossing to Hever Castle. They were amazed by the water maze (where a staff member praised the sensible way our children explored the watery challenge) and excited in the hedge maze. They loved the immaculate beauty of the Italian gardens and the rest of the grounds. They saw koi carp, ducks and geese throughout the grounds. Of course, they loved exploring Hever Castle itself, the home of Henry VIII's second wife Anne Boleyn and the place that

he proposed to her. They were very respectful, sensible and enthusiastic throughout, and have learned so much to support their 'Magnificent Monarchs' work.





In D & T this week, year 3 have been making the wooden frame for our mini greenhouses. We have used our accurate measuring skills to ensure each part is equal length. We have worked safely with junior hacksaws and clamps, to cut the parts to the correct length. Finally, under adult supervision we used a hot glue gun to join two lengths of wood to make a butt joint.









In the Nest, we made toast as a life skill. The children added bread to the toaster, buttered, cut and ate their toast. After, the children sequenced the activity using images of the different stages. This was a very successful and delicious activity for all of the children. We look forward to adding to this activity with different toppings on the forthcoming weeks.

<u>Important information - Term time holidays</u>

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays. We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed straight to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found quilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.

- Black school shoes or ALL BLACK trainers (including black soles no big logos or brand names).


















Wristbands cost £7.00 each available via the school office.




