## Happy Friday, Fairhouse Families!

I hope you all managed to enjoy the two-week break: it was lovely to welcome the children back to school on Tuesday. It is always difficult returning after two weeks off but everyone has settled back into their routines very well. This is a short half-term, with another bank holiday coming up soon (Monday 5th May), but will undoubtedly be a busy one.

Our year 6 children have been working incredibly hard towards the SATs tests – which are held on the week beginning 12th May. This is the final stretch before the tests and the last chance to cram some knowledge in! Please do continue to support your child with their learning at home.

This week has seen our pupils running a 2 mile mini-marathon in support of Reminiscence Learning. We are very proud of their commitment to this cause and they have supported each other through this difficult task very well. If your child has raised money via sponsorship but has not yet brought it in to school, please do so by the end of next week.



Today, Miss Dunne held a DT day for some of our keen designers across the school. The children were tasked with completing an engineering challenge to design and make tractors in preparation for our entry into the Essex Schools YFC Show competition. This challenge gave pupils the opportunity to use a range of tools and explore a variety of different materials. Their hard work paid off and has resulted in a number of entries to put forward in the hope to win some fantastic prizes for our amazing school. Well done to all the pupils who took part today!



We also re-launched our 'Friendship Fridays' at lunchtime today. Every Friday, our Early Years and Key Stage 1 children will play on the main playground along with the Key Stage 2 children. This has been hugely successful previously: the younger children love the chance to play on the 'big' play area and the older children always showcase how kind, caring and responsible they can be with the younger children.

You should have all received the knowledge organisers for your children before the Easter break. This covers some of the core learning relating to their upcoming topic. It is beneficial to go through this with your child. It will give them a 'head-start' with their learning, which can help lower anxieties and improve confidence. On Wednesday, next week, we have the ACL joining us for a Managing Big Emotions Workshop, this course is for parents & carers to learn practical strategies to help their child navigate and manage overwhelming emotions, fostering resilience and emotional well-being. ### Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club MUST be pre-booked via ParentPay. Bookings should be made 24hrs in advance.


Breakfast club runs from 8am - 8.40am and costs £2 per child per day. Last entry is at 8.15am.

Parents <u>MUST</u> accompany their child to the main doors by the office where they will be met and registered by a member of staff. Various breakfast options will be available such as cereal, toast & crumpets as well as fresh juice & milk.

### Parking in the local area

Please drive with caution and be aware of children outside the school, there have been a few near misses with vehicles driving and reversing at speed.

Please also be considerate of our neighbours when dropping off and collecting your children from school. We have received a number of complaints from local residents due to parents parking on & blocking the entrances / driveways at Fairhouse Court and Napier Close at drop off and pick up



### <u>Important information - Term time holidays</u>

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays. We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed straight to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found quilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.
