#### Dear families

This week, we held one of our half-termly "creative curriculum" days. This is a day where the children come off of their usual timetable to take part in lessons and learning that is often "messier" and celebrates creativity.

Year 1 have had a busy week! We have used what we know about mixing primary colours to make a range of secondary colour tones. We used light blue and dark blue with red to make light purple and dark purple! In science, we pulled on all of our knowledge of materials and their properties. We were challenged with making bunting to decorate an outdoor area of the school - the bunting needed to withstand wind, rain and also look nice. We will be testing how our six different buntings survive over the

weekend!



As part of their design and technology topic, the children in year 2 learnt about 'Remarkable Recipes'. They explored where food comes from and what equipment is required when cooking. The children also discovered the five reasons why humans cook food. Later in the

afternoon, year 2 followed the instructions of a recipe to make an Eton Mess!




Year 5 spent their curriculum day exploring pneumatics. After spending time investigating the effects of compressed air through an experiment using bottles and balloons, the children were then given the task of working in groups to create two pneumatic systems of their own that would produce movement. Both classes were successful when

creating a monster that could open and close its mouth and a fully functioning crane. Well done, Year 5!

Last week, we trained 35 of our KS2 children as Anti-bullying Ambassadors. We had a trainer from Kidscape who came and led a 2 hour training session around identifying bullying and how to solve issues. Our children were fantastic and showed real maturity. We now have 35 new Anti- bullying Ambassadors in our school!

## <u>Important information - Term time holidays</u>

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays. We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed straight to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found quilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.
