It's that time again already! The weeks are flying past.

Year 5 continue to delve into the Shang Dynasty as part of their history topic. After becoming familiar with the nine-year archaeological dig in Yinxu, pupils are now exploring the various artefacts found at the site as well as the alloys and





materials commonly used. This week, they have been researching the use of bronze. In pairs, they identified how it is produced, decorated and used specifically for rituals in ancient China.



This week, Year 2 were learning how to write instructions. Of course, in order to write the instructions, they had to follow some first - so we made 'fairy bread.' The children really enjoyed following the steps of the recipe to cut, butter and sprinkle in order to make this delicious snack. I wonder if any made some at home now they know how? They then

ordered the steps to make a writing plan and wrote it using the correct layout and imperative verbs such as cut, spread, sprinkle and eat!




This week, Year 6 have been delving deeper into the fascinating world of the circulatory system! They learned all about the different types of blood vessels in the

body — the arteries that carry blood away from the heart, the tiny capillaries where exchanges take place, and the veins that return blood back to the heart. To showcase their understanding, the children created eye-catching posters packed full of facts, diagrams, and detailed explanations about how these vessels keep our bodies working smoothly.





This week, in Year 1, as part of our history lesson we used family photos to create our own family trees. We also carried out some experiments in science to identify which materials are waterproof.



5 read two poems together with fantastic levels of confidence and performing skills. From Year 2, Paul and Ameva read a poem together with an excellent sense of teamwork and extremely loud and clear voices. Also from Year 2, Anabel and Clara performed together with a remarkable sense of co-ordination and the entire hall enjoyed hearing their poetry. All of the children received a certificate to keep. While there were no winners for this event, it was clear that all of the children from Fairhouse were skilful, brave and very well-prepared. As well as this, we all had a fantastic time meeting



other children and staff from across the trust and watching all of the children shine.

Please also be considerate of our neighbours when dropping off and collecting your children from school. We have received a number of complaints from local residents due to parents parking on & blocking the entrances / driveways at Fairhouse Court and Napier Close at drop off and pick up times



<u>Important information - Term time holidays</u>

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays. We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed straight to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found quilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.
