Dear families

Welcome to the end of this very cold week.

Our attendance has been very good all week – except for today where we have seen a big drop. Please do continue to send your child to school all week – even if they are under the weather. I promise we will call you if we feel they are not coping and need to be at home in bed.

This week, our year 5 pupils have been taking part in Bikeability. They have done a great job of braving the cold (and wet) weather to learn how to safely ride their bikes, taking account of road safety, and the rules of cycling safely on the roads. A huge thank you to the staff who have also been out there in the cold, on bikes, to help support this great scheme. Our Bikeability sessions continue into next week too.

In Year 1, we have been looking at maps. We began with a frosty walk around the local area, before tracking our journey on a map when we came back to school. We then used those to help us draw our own map and come up with symbols for a key. To finish up our map work this week, we completed a Now Press Play activity where we had to follow a map and directions to rescue someone from a fire breathing dragon! In maths, we have been using equality and inequality symbols to show more than and less than when comparing numbers. We used cubes and counters to represent our numbers.













This week, Year 6 have been diving into global geography by learning how time zones work. Pupils explored the Earth's meridians - discovering how many there are and why they're arranged that way - and used GMT (Greenwich Mean Time) to calculate local times across different regions of the world. After practising their new skills, the children put their knowledge to the test with a fun quiz.

Year 4 pupils have been busy learning how to round numbers to the nearest 1000. They have been counting in multiples of thousands and using number lines and place value charts to help them to find the multiple of 100 that is closest to any given number.

In EYFS, the children have been reading 'Night monkey Day monkey'. They discussed the difference between day and night and sorted activities into daytime and night time. The children painted moon pictures using black and white paint. They discovered that when they mixed these two colours together it made the colour grey.







Our Christmas Fayre will be taking place on Friday 5th December and is fast approaching! We are still on the look out for raffle and tombola prizes, if you have anything suitable please bring it to the school office and we will make good use of it. We would particularly like items such as new and unused gift sets and bottles of any kind such as wine, squash, bubble bath, etc.

And finally, with this cold weather we are experiencing, please do make sure your child has a warm and preferably waterproof coat in school with them. Hats, gloves and scarves would be useful too but these are of course optional. And as always, please make sure everything is clearly labelled with your child's name as without that we really struggle to reunite lost or misplaced items with their rightful owners!

<u>Important information - Term time holidays</u>

Improving school attendance is a key priority for all schools across Essex. Where families choose to take a family holiday during term time, this can detrimentally impact a pupil's progress and can prevent them from fulfilling their true academic potential. Our school attendance policy, available via our school website, clearly sets out the process that parents should follow if they wish to apply for leave during term time. Please note that applications should only be made, if you feel that there are exceptional circumstances which mean that the leave cannot be taken during the school holidays. We would ask all parents to note that, where families choose to go on holiday during term time and the absences are coded as unauthorised, Essex County Council may not issue penalty notices and may instead proceed straight to prosecution and place the case directly before the Magistrates for their consideration in court. If found quilty by the Magistrates, parents could face a fine of up to £2,500 and/or 3 months imprisonment.

- Black school shoes or ALL BLACK trainers (including black soles no big logos or brand names).















